Dear Tribal Leader:

The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, is the primary federal agency for improving health care to people who are geographically isolated, economically, or medically vulnerable.

HRSA programs help those in need of high-quality primary health care, people with HIV/AIDS, pregnant women, mothers, and children. HRSA also supports the training of health professionals, the distribution of providers to areas where they are needed most, and improvements in health care delivery, including rural health and telehealth.

As part of HRSA's commitment to Indian Country's health care needs, this letter serves as official notice of HRSA's intent to hold its Annual Tribal Consultation with tribes. The consultation will be conducted as a virtual meeting in conjunction with the National Indian Health Board's 2021 National Tribal Health Conference on October 8, 2021, 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM EDT. Topics will include the Health Center Program's Uniform Data System and the scoring of Health Professional Shortage Areas.
