## Dear Director Vought,

Consistent with the President's longstanding support for tribal self-determination and self-governance, we write to respectfully request that the President's FY 2026 Budget to Congress include a request that Congress reclassify "contract support costs" and "105(*l*) leasing costs" as mandatory payments, consistent with two recent Supreme Court decisions finding these payments are required by law.

As you know, the cornerstone of the Nation's policy with Indian Tribes is the Indian Self-Determination Act. That Act requires the award of certain contracts to Indian Tribes, so that Federal agency trust services are operated by the Tribes themselves, rather than by government agencies (principally the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Indian Health Service).

The Act mandates both the award of the contracts and the payment of specific sums called "contract support costs." In *Salazar v. Ramah Navajo Chapter*, 567 U.S. 182 (2012), the Supreme Court ruled that full payment of contract support costs is required by law. In lower court litigation, the courts have ruled that IHS and BIA leasing payments under section 105(l) of the Act are also required by law. And last June the Supreme Court in *Becerra v San Carlos Apache Tribe*, 602 U.S. 222 (2024),

addressed the amount of the contract support cost payments that the Secretary of Health & Human Services is required to pay.

Given the nature of these mandatory payments under the law (as contrasted with discretionary appropriations), the undersigned Tribes and tribal organizations respectfully request that the President's FY 2026 Budget call upon Congress to reclassify these tribal contract payments as "mandatory" payments and remove them from the discretionary appropriations process.

Thank you for your continuing commitment to tribal self-determination and self-governance.
